## Presidents Overview:

### President's Report – DVE Aquatic Club Incorporated - 2025 AGM

Lee Anderson, President – DVE Aquatic Club Inc.

It is my pleasure to present the President's Report for the 2024/2025 season — a year that has seen DVE Aquatic continue to grow, adapt, and deliver strong programs across swimming, diving, and water polo.

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#### Membership & Club Growth

We finish the season with the largest membership since our club's merger in 2012 — **350 members**, an increase of fifty-seven from last year. Growth was recorded across almost every category:

- Competitive swimmers: +31
- Divers: +6
- Dry members: +20
- Water Polo: steady player numbers with a slight increase in junior registrations
- Strong representation from both returning families and new members.

This growth reflects the dedication of our coaches, volunteers, and committee members, and the appeal of the programs we deliver for all ages and abilities.

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#### Swimming

Swimming has remained strong, with **ninety-five swimmers** across s quads from Development through to National level. This season saw:

Thirteen club records broken at our Club Championships

Exceptional representation at the Victorian State Schools and Associations Competition

Five swimmers selected for **TeamVIC** for the National School Swimming Championships in 2025

- Continued growth in junior squad numbers, supported by increased lane space and coaching presence.
- A successful 12-hour Swimathon raising funds for **Berry Street**, with participation across all squads within our club.

The swimming committee has also worked hard on compliance, governance updates, and budget management, finishing the year in a strong financial position.

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## Diving

While diving took a short break earlier this year, all **nine divers** are returning for the new season.

- Training session has been extended from 60 to 90 minutes with positive results.
  - Plans are in place to increase coaching capacity, with Maddie Munro to attend a Level 1 coaching course.
- 

## Water Polo

Water Polo has delivered another vibrant year, highlighted by:

Two successful **Come and Try** events.

Hosting a round of the Invitational Interclub with over two hundred attendees

Five athletes representing Victoria at the U13 nationals in Hobart.

Three athletes selected for the U15 East Coast Challenge in Melbourne

Dedicated team entries across senior and junior levels for the upcoming season

While Water Polo posted a small loss for the year, the sub-committee is actively addressing these issues. The group remains strong, with good representation and succession planning for key committee roles.

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## Events & Community

- The **54th Annual Swimathon** once again brought the whole club together, combining fun, participation, and community support.
  - Across the year, our committees and volunteers have strengthened relationships with partner facilities, worked on pathway opportunities for athletes, and kept DVE visible in the local sporting landscape.

- Expanding coaching and competition capacity in diving
- Managing facility relationships to secure lane and training space for our growing squads

- Continuing to build financial resilience across all disciplines

Our volunteers are the strength of DVE Aquatic. With the support of dedicated people, we will continue to grow — but we also invite more parents and families to step in and help wherever they can. Every contribution makes a real difference and is appreciated.

## Diving Report:

### DVE Aquatic Diving report 2024-25

Our season started with only 1 member returning.

We reached out to Diving Victoria for some assistance with club and coaching fees and were advised that the board would not assist with any reduction.

Also reached out to Carey Grammar for a reduction in pool hire fees. Carey responded with a reduction of approximately 25% until June 2025.

This has now increase, although I am still negotiating for a reduced rate.

With 9 members at \$18.00 per session we will more than cover pool hire at the higher rate

DVE assisted with social media advertising and posters were printed and installed at Carey Grammer, Watermark and other areas to help build numbers.

Within a short time, enquiries were coming in with new members joining.

At the start of 2025 we had 13 registered members and 10 of those were active

Training is progressing well and now have a new trainee coach Maddison Munro.

Maddison is 18 years of age and had recently retired from diver due to school and work commitments. We have for several years has Maddison's mum, Chelsea Munro as our competition's coordinator. Chelsea is also a former DVE member competing both in swimming and diving. Ken Houghton has also continued as assistant coach.

Our training program is continuing well with new dives for all divers, and our fortnightly aggregate competition is eagerly attended.

At this point we have 9 registered members and 2 letters of offer to join the diving squad.

## Swimming Report:

### Annual Swimming Report 2024/2025

2024-2025 year was a busy and eventful year. It saw 6 meets being held, a number of fundraising activities and a lot of competitions to give the swimmers race practice, development opportunities and provide qualifying time option.

In 2024-2025 DVE commenced a series of swimming skills clinics open to both DVE and other club swimmers. Clinics covered skills specific to the strokes, as well as starts, variety of turns and underwater skills. Clinics has become very popular, and we will look to expand the offering during 2526.

Specifics for each component of DVE swimming for 2024-2025 are outlined below.

## Squads

The squad numbers continued to recover post significant reduction at the start of 23-24 year and consistently grew. 24-25 finished with the highest growth in numbers in the last 7 years.

DVE Swimming will need to consider its programs and growth opportunities, as well as resources that will be required to achieve the growth – coaching and pool space.

Throughout 2024–25, our swimmers have continued to advance their skills, enabling us to provide more tailored development opportunities. Strong results at District and State competitions, supported by our highly skilled and consistent coaching team, have strengthened the club’s

reputation and attracted new members from other clubs during the year. With a number of athletes now performing at the high level, the club have been running an additional performance-focused training session over 24-25. Additional equipment to support the development across all levels have been purchased and made available to all the squads. We will continue to monitor and balance the developmental needs across all squads and skills levels in 25-26.

## Coaches

We have an exceptional group of coaches, all with significant and robust experience in developing junior and senior swimmers. Due to the ongoing growth in numbers across the junior squads, late in 24-25 DVE searched for the additional coach and were able to sign up coach Chow.

With the new additional coach, our strong coaching team is further strengthened to support the development of our swimmers and attract new members as a club with experienced coaches.

The level of coaching resources within DVE, consistency and dedication to our swimmers has been consistently high and resulted with over 30% of DVE swimmers participating in Metro events, 2025% in State Age events, 18% in the State Open events and 12% in the National events.

All our coaches provide an exceptional support to our swimmer, and in 24-25 special mention goes out to coach Frank, who in 24-25 achieved one of the highest honours in his distinguished career with induction into the CSCAA Hall of Fame in the United States. This recognition, alongside his gold medal performance in the Australian Surf Race (age group) and his induction into the Point Leo SLSC Hall of Fame reflects his remarkable contribution to the sport. With multiple decades in swimming, numerous records, and a history of world-class performances, Frank now brings this wealth of skill and experience to support the growth and development of DVE swimmers.

## Financial Position

In 2024–25, the Swimming section achieved a solid financial outcome despite the challenges of transitioning from cash to accrual accounting. The introduction of an upgraded financial system has provided more accurate and transparent tracking of costs and revenue, supporting stronger decision-making.

New revenue opportunities were also explored, with the stroke clinic proving particularly successful in contributing to the year's results. The introduction of additional payment options improved payment turnaround times, resulting in only a limited volume of outstanding invoices at year-end. Looking ahead, cost management will remain a priority as pool hire, superannuation, and coaching expenses continue to rise. A new volunteer Finance Swimming role has been established and allows to enhance financial oversight and provide support to the VP Swimming.

## Pools & Dryland

We continue to have great relationships with the WaterMarc and Eltham Leisure swimming pools. Both pools have already advised of the 4-5% increase anticipated every 6 months for the lane hire fees; this will need to be considered for the next 6-monthly cost review.

Dryland program continued at and is progressing very well. The program over the year gained greater attendance with the team utilising all areas of the gym.

## Swimming Sub-committee

Volunteers involved in our swimming sub-committee continue to go above and beyond the requirements of their roles.

With some of the swimming families departing the club, transferring or finishing their swimming, we required to replace several positions. Swimming Committee is always full of activities and tasks to do and would welcome any new volunteers. Special thank you goes out to all the volunteers for their support throughout the year.

## Performance throughout the year

The below highlights outline the events and achievements of our DVE Swimmers.

## July 2024

Late in July, DVE participated VIC SC Metro Championships. There was an outstanding performance from all the swimmers with many improving or achieving State QTs for the upcoming Open and Age SC Championships. Particular note goes out to the following swimmers:

## February 2025

The Jackson Car Long Course Meet was a highlight of February 2025, bringing together swimmers, families, and the wider community in a

successful day of competition and support. The event showcased the commitment of our swimmers, coaches, and volunteers, whose efforts ensured smooth delivery and a positive experience for all participants.

Importantly, the meet also served as a fundraising initiative, with over \$3,000 raised for the Olivia.

DVE LC Meet on 15<sup>th</sup> March was very successful, with multiple swimmers showing significant improvements and some achieving National Qualifying times. The brief induction for timekeepers and marshals was implemented, which assisted in the smooth running of the event.

DVE swimmers are also performing well at school swimming, with most swimming meets held across

Primary & Secondary Government Schools as well as non-government ones. There are a number of DVE swimmers who achieved places at District, Division and Regional championships. Several of our swimmers are progressing to the State level events. Congratulations, and well done to swimmers and coaches.

## April 2025

April is a quieter month for the swimmers that don't attend Australian National Age and Open

Championships. DVE swimmers took their opportunity to recuperate, focus on their strokes at the DVE Stroke clinic lead by our new coach Chow and commenced the transition to the short course championships.

At the same time our DVE National team fought it out in warm and wet Brisbane at the 2025 Australian National Age and Open Championships. This year we had a smaller team with 8 and 4 swimmers participating in each championship respectively. However, team has delivered a strong result, finishing within 100 clubs overall, with 250+ clubs participating.

For the National Age championship, we had 3 novices in a team of 8 swimmers. All swimmers showed grit, determination and were absolute superstars with a number of PBs and finals. Coach Brian was very impressed with the team camaraderie, support and respect to competitors, highlighting excellent team culture and sportsmanship.

The club's 2025 Swimathon was completed in late May in the 12-hour format. Excellent participation from across the whole club. Further on this is provided in the President's report. Funds raised will be provided to the Berry St Charity, which supports local youths and families.

School swimming came to a close during this reporting period, and we have 5 swimmers who were successful in being selected as part of TeamVIC for National School Swimming Championship in July at Brisbane – Jason, Zoe, Amity, Ashley and Ruby. Water polo has again had record membership for our club, and we have seen a large growth in player participation. This is on back of a relatively low growth of new members by year-on-year standing with 38 new members this season down from 52 in 2023-24. ## Registrars Report:

### DVE Registrar's Annual Report 2024/25

DVE Aquatic had a total of 350 members at the end of the season, 57 more than the previous season and the largest membership since the club merged in 2012.

Competitive swimmer registrations increased by 31, and Dry member registrations increased by 20. Water Polo player registrations increased by 5, whereas Water Polo coaches and volunteers reduced by 5. The number of registered Divers increased by 6, and Diving coaches and volunteers stayed the same. A number of members were registered under more than one category.

By age group, the 12 and under had 28 more members; the 13 to 17 years had 4 more members; the 18 to 21 years had 7 more members; and the over 21 age group had 18 more members. The total membership aged 21 and under comprised 125 males and 85 females- both males and females showing significant increases over last season. In the over 21 age group, females outnumbered males by 88 to 50 reflecting more female parent/guardian registrations. Both groups had more members than the previous season.

Membership breakdown is shown on a separate page along with a comparison with last season. The total registrations for each of our main activities Swimming, Diving, and Water Polo are shown. There is then a 'netting' factor to take account of members who have registered in more than one activity.

231 members renewed their membership, 119 new members joined, 83 did not renew membership, and 2 transferred out during the season.

#### 1. Overview

The 2025 DVE Aquatic Swimathon was a 12-hour community fundraising event supporting Berry Street and young people in need. The event united club members, community leaders, volunteers, and athletes in a high-energy, inclusive celebration of swimming, spirit, and social impact.

Key Stats:

- 18,089 laps swum (450+ km total)
- \$7,000+ raised for Berry Street (with donations still open)
- 74 participating swimmers (across all squads)
- Exceeded several 12-hour records, including some 24-hour benchmarks

#### Additional Financial Information

The total amount raised during the 2025 Swimathon was \$7,402.47. After processing fees (Gateway fee of \$181.79), the net amount raised was \$7,220.68.

In line with our fundraising agreement, this net amount was split 50/50 between DVE Aquatic Club and Berry Street.

Berry Street collected all donations directly, provided tax-deductible receipts, and managed donor engagement, including capturing a mailing list.

As per our arrangement, DVE Aquatic Club has invoiced Berry Street for our 50% share of the proceeds: **\*\*\$3,610.00\*\***. The invoice was requested to be processed before the end of June to ensure it falls within the current financial year.

#### 2. Highlights

##### **Outstanding Athletic Efforts:**

1,000 laps completed by a 13-year-old National Squad swimmer, Zoe Macaulay – finished with a powerful butterfly finale, cheered on by all.

850 laps by one of our Life Members, Roland Van Oorschot – showing intergenerational commitment to swimming.

**Club-wide Involvement:**

Participation from swimming, diving, water polo squads, families, alumni, and life members. Lane sharing with the broader WaterMarc community throughout the day.

**Special Guests:**

Ahmed Kelly – Paralympian and guest speaker who swam 60 laps with participants and delivered a motivational talk on resilience and overcoming obstacles.

Tara Kinder – Australian Dolphin and past DVE swimmer, who offered encouragement to athletes and supported volunteers.

Federal MP Kate Thwaites, State MP Colin Brooks & Local Banyule Councilor Mark Di Pasquale.

**Support & Atmosphere:**

Massage therapy by Joshua Hargreaves for swimmer recovery. Free for everyone from 10am to end of day.

BBQ 10.30am brunch (bacon and egg toasties) and 5.30pm sausage sizzle donated by Bob Oldfield, Scully Bros and Chris Anderson. Cooked by volunteers and President’s family – fuelling athletes throughout the day.

Fabulous opening with ceremonial dive-in of club captains Cooper Rushmeyer and Eliza Connolly, opening with formal welcomes from Federal MP Kate Thwaites and State MP Colin Brooks.

- Strong community attendance and team spirit across all age groups.
- High engagement from political figures, alumni, and guest athletes boosted event profile.
- Seamless coordination with WaterMarc for lane hire and scheduling.
- Record-breaking participation and lap counts.
- Smooth logistics on the day, including food, massage, and volunteer coordination.

The Profit and Loss Balance for Financial Year 24/25 from 01 Jul 2024 to 30 Jun 2025 show a Net Loss of **\$4,877.68**. Our total asset remains healthy valued at **\$125,727.76** comprised of available cash in our Statement and Term Deposit Accounts and other Fixed Assets

Our financial position is set to anticipate the operating cost of FY 25/26 including: increased superannuation for our coaches to 12% from 01 July 2025, adjustment to coach rates, pool hires. Each discipline VP will allow for the expected increased cost for in this year budget and consider if increment for our club member contributions is necessary to cover the cost.

All club obligations for last financial year for last financial year have been met as 10 Aug 2025.

### Conclusion
